

PREVENTED PLANT ACRES FAQS

If I'm concerned that I may not be able to get my crop planted, what should I do?

Contact your crop insurance agent. The agent can provide details on your prevented planting coverage and how and when to file a claim. You may be eligible for prevented planting, if there are conditions, such as excess moisture during the normal planting period that prevent planting by the final planting date. Consideration is given to whether the cause of loss is general to the surrounding area for that crop.

*Plant a cover crop and receive a full prevented planting payment provided the cover crop is not hayed or grazed before November 1, or otherwise harvested at any time. If the cover crop is hayed or grazed before November 1, the prevented planting payment on the first crop is reduced to 35 percent of the first crop's prevented planting guarantee.
